#### **SOK District Board Meets**

The District Board would like to thank the Potsdam congregation for their warm hospitality in hosting the their meeting on Saturday, March 24. There was a lot of positive energy at the board meeting as they discussed ways we can better communicate with one another. They recognize the lack of current technology for many congregations and discussed the formation of a technology team to assist congregations and pastors address this issue.

The board heard a report about the Racial Justice Team and their important work in these times. Lucas Keller was announced as the new leader of the team and they are looking forward to his leadership. We discussed about how they are working together but also independent of the Standing With People of Color Committee formed in answer to the query we sent to Annual Conference last summer.

The Board also received an update on the progress of the Visioning Committee as well as the other commissions who are busy with their responsibilities. It was reported that the sale of the Mack Memorial property was completed to a Hispanic congregation with \$226,221 being received and deposited. The funds have been allocated to the Board Discretionary Fund for future use as determined by the board. We were given a good reminder at the end of the meeting that Jesus is at the center of everything we do and everything we plan moving forward.

Since East Dayton Fellowship is a congregation formed by both the Church of the Brethren and the Brethren In Christ denominations, we are inviting churches from both denominations to come help clean up. This is an opportunity to meet other Brethren (both COB & BIC) and to help the East Dayton neighborhood.

Registration, donuts, and coffee at 8:30am will lead to our dispersal through the streets and alleys around our church to clean up the discarded vodka bottles, mattresses, tires, and other junk that often fill up the abandoned spaces here. Volunteers will be provided gloves, trash bags, and trash grabbers. We hope to demonstrate Jesus' love for our neighbors by getting our hands dirty in the act of cleaning up.

After a few hours of work, we will break bread together with a delicious lunch. We hope you will be able to join us, shoulder to shoulder, in this work and that you will let us serve you a meal and enjoy some koinonia with you!

# Southern Ohio/Kentucky Disaster Ministries Updates

**BDM Sites** – In 2020 prior to Covid, Brethren Disaster Ministries had two BDM sites open at a time. This was reduced to one site with the added challenges of Covid and the availability of leaders and volunteers. In 2023 with reduced Covid concerns, the number of volunteer groups and leaders wanting to serve has increased. For two weeks in April and ten weeks in the fall, two rebuild sites will be open. The Dawson Springs, KY tornado recovery site will be open throughout 2023. In April a short-term site will be open in eastern KY for flood recovery. No announcement has been made for the location of the second site in the fall.
