Turning Swords into Plowshares: The Story of the Seagoing Cowboys and the Heifer Project

Trotwood Church of the Brethren is having Peggy Reiff Miller give her presentation of "The Seagoing Cowboy", a book she has written about her 20 year study of the little known history of the seagoing cowboys. Through historical images on screen and verbal presentation she tells the story of World War II ships and the lives of many men transformed into vessels of peace thru the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration and Brethren Service Committee and its Heifer Project program. Many southwestern Ohio people played roles in this story of turning "swords into plowshares" including Heifer International founder Dan West and Dayton International Peace Museum co-founder Ralph Dull.

CDS Workers Serve – Children's Disaster Services (CDS) has recently had two deployments. Two S. Ohio/KY workers went to Marble Hill, MO, the site of an EF2 tornado on April 5. Another team of CDS workers, including one volunteer from our district, worked in the Little Rock, Arkansas area. Here a series of three tornadoes hit the area on March 31. Both teams set up childcare centers in a MARC (Multi-Agency Resource Center). They cared for children, providing a safe and comforting place where children can play and receive emotional support while their parents/guardians are working with the available agencies to obtain needed assistance.
