Southern Ohio/Kentucky Disaster Ministries Updates

BDM Meeting – Start the new year by attending the BDM meeting on Thursday, January 4, 2024 at Mill Ridge Village Community Center. Hear from volunteers who served at the Brethren Service Center and from those on the October and November rebuilding trips to Kentucky. We'll review the ministry accomplished in 2023 and look ahead to 2024 opportunities. Fellowship Time is at 6:30 PM, and the meeting is at 7:00 PM.

Rebuilding Trips – S. Ohio/KY BDM has a rebuilding trip scheduled for most months of 2024. January through June will be to Dawson Springs, KY, where we will continue to work with Habitat for Humanity. There's room for three more volunteers on the Jan. 14-20 crew. Volunteers are also needed for March 10-16.

Note that several months are claimed by a congregation: April-Oakland, May-New Carlisle, and June -Happy Corner. We do need others to put their names on the waiting list for these trips. If the designated congregation doesn't fill all the slots, other BDMers will join the crew. On the July 21-27 trip we're encouraging both youth and adults to serve. Let's have parents come with a youth (14 yrs.+) or

grandparents/another adult with a youth (15 yrs. +). Invite a youth from your church to serve with you. We're planning for a rich intergenerational experience!

Sewing Bee/CWS Prep – In 2024 Sewing Bees will be held February through October on the fourth Saturday of the month at 9:00 AM. They will alternate between Greenville COB and Eaton Community Church. Volunteers will sew school bags for Church World Service (CWS) school kits. Non-sewers will prep items for school kits and cleanup buckets. 2023 Data – Support to S. Ohio/KY BDM was given in many forms: as a rebuilding volunteer, CDS volunteer, sewing school bags, assembling CWS kits, helping with fundraisers, financial contributions, and prayer. All are greatly appreciated as together we bring hope and share God's love with disaster survivors.

Rebuilding -13 trips with 125 volunteers to Dawson Springs, KY and Jackson, KY at a cost of \$4,800

Children's Disaster Services (CDS) – 8 volunteers served on 5 deployments in Missouri, Arkansas, Hawaii, Illinois, and Guam

Church World Service (CWS) - 528 Cleanup Buckets, 3,239 Hygiene Kits, and 3,043 School Kits were assembled for \$55,300. At nine Sewing Bees,103 participants sewed bags for school kits or prepped items for CWS buckets/kits. 300 volunteers worked at the Kit/Bucket Assemblies.
