Southern Ohio/Kentucky Disaster Ministries Updates

CDS Volunteers Serve – In response to the series of tornadoes that hit the Midwest on March 14, Children's Disaster Services (CDS) deployed volunteers from the S. Ohio/KY District to two Multi Agency Recovery Centers (MARCs). The week of March 17 one volunteer was sent to Russells Point and two were sent to Lakeview, in the Indian Lake area. Children were provided with a safe and secure environment in which to play while families sought assistance to aid in their recovery.

Volunteer Rebuilding Opportunities – Our current site in Dawson Springs, KY has been extended to mid-August. We're working on tornado recovery as we partner with Habitat for Humanity.
