#### 2023 SOK District Conference

Another successful District Conference is now a part of our history. Thank you to the West Charleston congregation for sharing their space with us, to the Program and Arrangements Committee for planning and implementing, to Jonathan Shively and Nate Polzin who shared gifts of leadership, to the staff and District Board who shared many exciting things that are happening in the district, to our Moderator, Ty Pyles who led the conference gracefully, yet firmly and finally to all of the delegates and non-delegates who spoke respectively from their hearts, voted according to how the Spirit led them, and engaged in Christian fellowship with each other.

There were 91 delegates present, and 123 total registrants as well as several attendees who were not required to register. We welcome our new board members: Dottie Woodard, Trent Smith, Sie Brock, Jon Keller, and Rick Polhamus. New Program and Arrangements members are Kathy Reynolds and Isaac Zika. Our Moderator-Elect is Tom Menke.

The budget for 2024 was passed after minimal discussion but als with the ongoing concern for a continual decline in congregational and individual support. We recognized the East Dayton Fellowship as an official congregation and heard of the wonderful ministries they are providing in their neighborhood. We also said goodby to the West Alexandria Congregation who is leaving the denomination and to the Prices Creek Congregation who is closing after 189 years of faithfully serving their community.

Finally, we discussed the proposed query: Setting Aside the "1983 Paper on Human Sexuality from a Christian Perspective". After 16 heartfelt but respectful speeches, 8 for and 8 against, the vote was taken paper ballot. 44 voted in favor of sending the query and 44 voted against. This means the query will not be passed on to Standing Committee.

We are so grateful for our wonderful district full of talented, passionate, and devoted members serving God and following Christ the best we can.
